Since 2021, the De:link//Re:link network of researchers has conducted field work documenting the influence of China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) - often colloquially known as the „New Silk Roads“ - on languages, societies, and cultures in various regions of Europe, Asia and Africa.

The consortium consists of diverse partners, all of which work together to convey local perspectives: Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin (HU), the Centre for East European and International Studies (ZOIS), the Bonn International Centre for Conflict Studies (BICC), and the Leibniz-Zentrum Moderner Orient (ZMO).

This booklet and the accompanying map present just some of the results of the multifaceted projects from across the globe.
